Indigo (1st & 3rd Kilmacolm Guides, Scotland) was impressed by this event and the fact that they were able to raise enough money for three operations with all their hard work, so when each of her patrol were asked a few months ago to make a presentation about their chosen charity, Indigo chose Operation Smile SA. She made a presentation to the rest of her patrol and they voted to choose this charity.

Their first task was to use some of the £10 to make and sell hot chocolate and biscuits to the other guides and parents. They 'grew' their £10 to £30. For their next initiative they decided to make Easter Jars to sell. They costed all the items needed to make this product and worked out their profit.

The product was an empty kiln jar filled with shredded paper for a nest, a chocolate rabbit, and mini eggs, with straw to decorate and a 'Happy Easter' label. They made and sold 15 of these and 'grew' their profit to £110.

Then on our recent visit to Cape Town, Tanya from Bothasig Guides kindly organised for Operation Smile representative Fiola (Operation Smile Student and Society Coordinator) to come to meet Indigo at their Guide meeting on 3rd April 2019 so that she could present the donation. Fiola also gave a wonderful presentation as to how the money will be spent.
